

Public Quarterly Meeting held at St Mary's Church Hall, The Fairway On Wednesday 25 April 2018 8pm.

1 Police

PC Derek and PC Marie spoke at the meeting and initially listed crimes in the area from 6 Feb to 25 April

Burglary 21, theft of motor vehicle 17, theft from shops 28, other theft 30, assault 30pedal cycle theft 1, drug offences 4, other crimes 62.

Various points were discussed re cyclists and motor vehicles converging in parts of the area. Residents were encouraged to contact via phone or email.

6 Traffic Congestion on Victoria Road

David Seaman read a note he had written addressed to "Mr Vice Chairman" regarding a letter that had been written to Cllr Burrows regarding vehicle congestion and road blockages. Mr Seaman wanted to know if we had received any response other than "they are looking into it".

Cllr Kauffman replied that the consultation re the residents parking had been completed but there was no final decision as yet. The situation of yellow lines between Arla and the Black Bull was discussed. The Residents Service Department are looking at the traffic issues with the intention of doing the least damage to carry out the works required.

Cllr Kauffman reported on the work on the Bridge at South Ruislip. D Knowles had met with TFL and said "things are looking good Allan".

7 SKLP

On the 4 April, Easter Saturday, the venue had been sub-let for a function with major traffic congestion. Cllr Judy Kelly has been dealing with this problem since she became a Councillor 12 years ago and the problem is still ongoing. She has spoken to Hillingdon's legal department over the years and suggested that the SRRA should look at taking legal action. This was opposed re the amount of money this would take and the fact that if Hillingdon Council were not prepared to take this on and they had far more resources that us it was suggested that we re-contact the Council to take this further.

Cllr Judy Kelly also said that after 12 years the situation at Glebe Farm was still causing concerns and hoped that her successor would continue to carry the baton.

There was a vote of thanks to Clir Kelly for all her hard work and support over the years.

Cllr Kauffman was asked to take a look at the Polish Memorial site to see if more could be done regarding the parking situation.
